Symbol supported

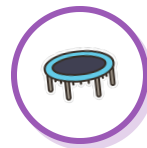
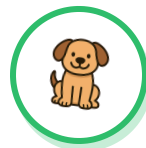
Circle, point, stamp, or glue. For students who do not write yet, including AAC users.

You introduce yourself too. Fill it out and post it for meet-the-teacher night, or send it home on day one.

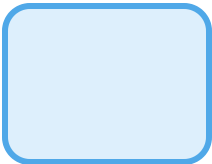


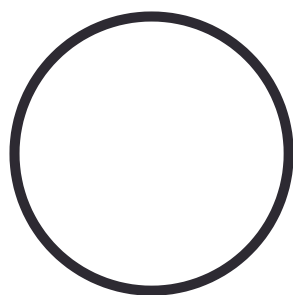
